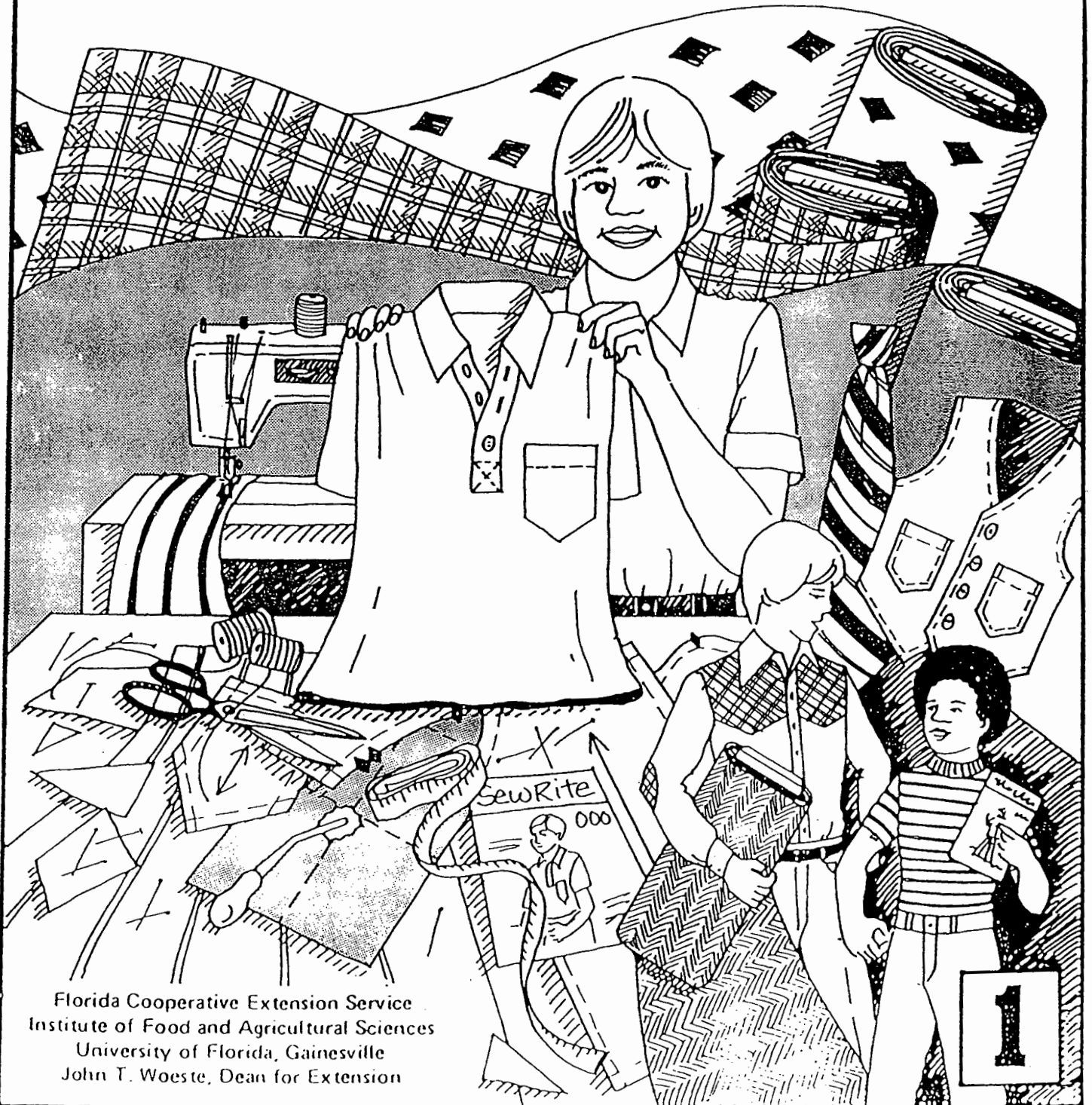

## 4-H Clothing I

### Use

Cotton or cotton-like fabrics that are firm

### Make At Least Two

- Oven Mitt
- Chef's or Bar-B-Que Apron
- Chef's hat
- Simple Vest
- Simple Poncho
- Simple Pants (elastic waist)

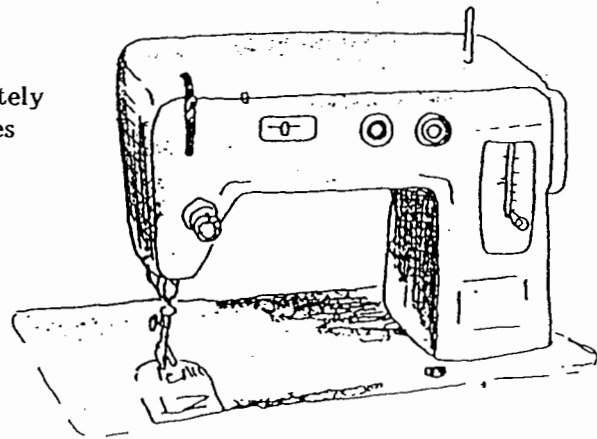
### Study

- Labeling of fabrics
- Cotton and cotton-like fabrics



### Learn At Least Two New Construction Techniques

- To use and care for the sewing machine (Know Your Sewing Machine)
- To use sewing equipment
- To pre-shrink fabric
- To straighten fabric
- To measure, cut and mark accurately
- To make simple seams and finishes
- To press
- To select fabric
- To use elastic in a casing
- To do simple hand stitches
- To identify grain
