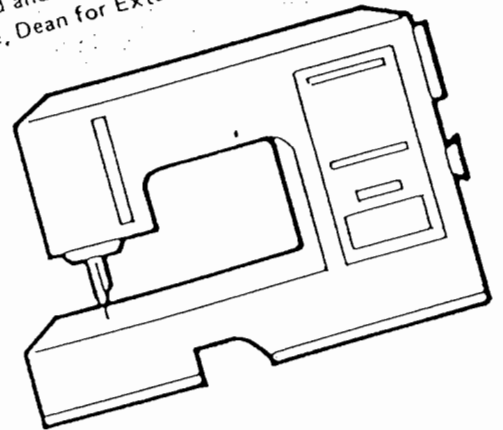
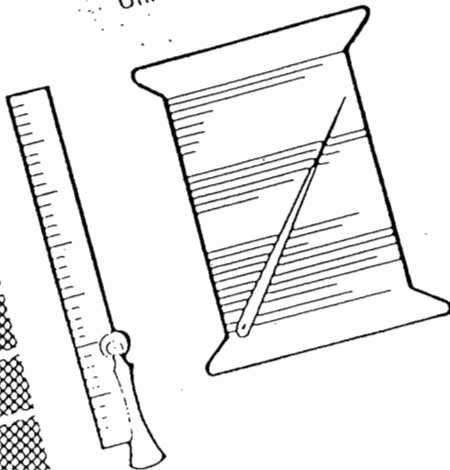

## Use...

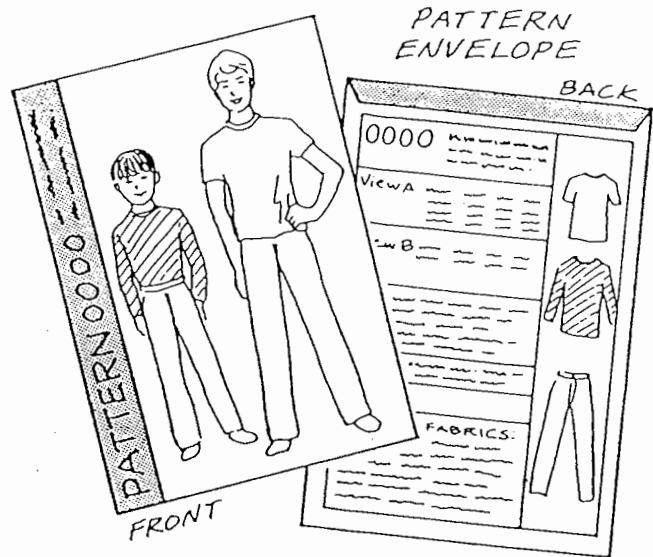
- A single knit

- Simple shirt

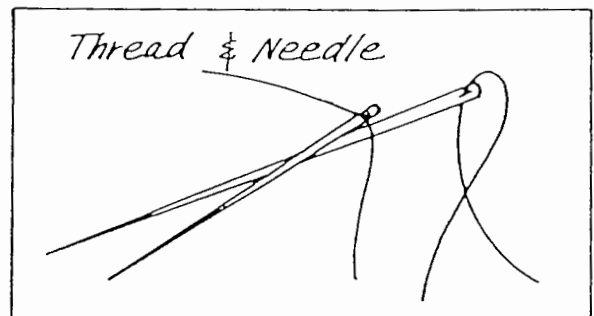
## Study...

- Basic knits



## Learn and do at least three new construction techniques...

- Select and use a commercial pattern
- Organize work
- Improve skills
- Accurately lay pattern on fabric
- Sew on single knits
- Finish seams
- Make machine or hand-worked buttonholes
- Use interfacing
- Preshrink notions
- Staystitch
- Apply ribbing
- Sew on buttons

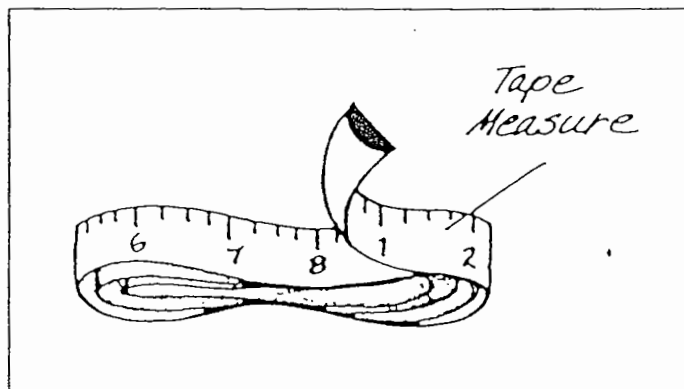


## Show and tell...
