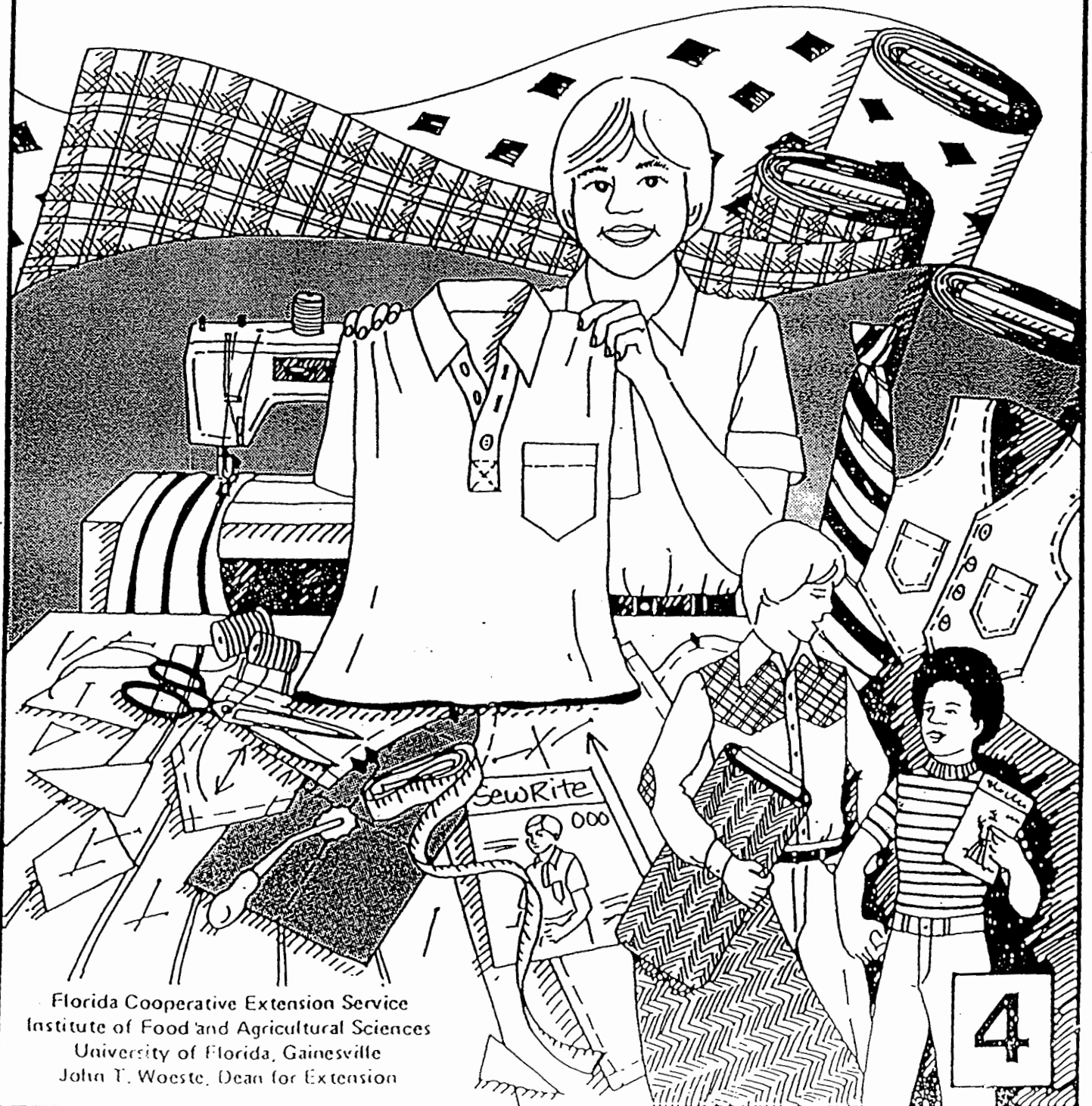

To make hand-worked keyhole buttonholes
To make welt pockets

To do a double yoke (shirt)
To do a continuous bound placket
To improve skills
